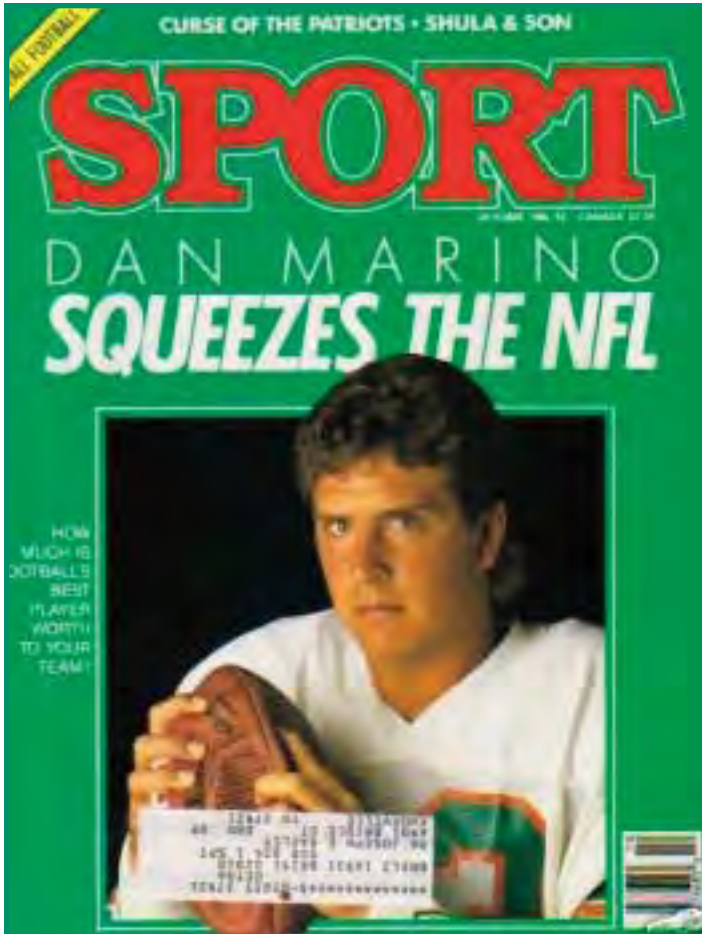

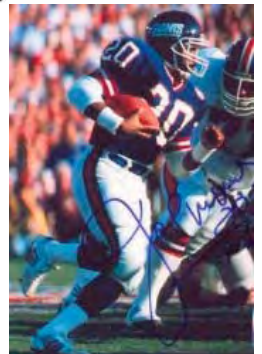
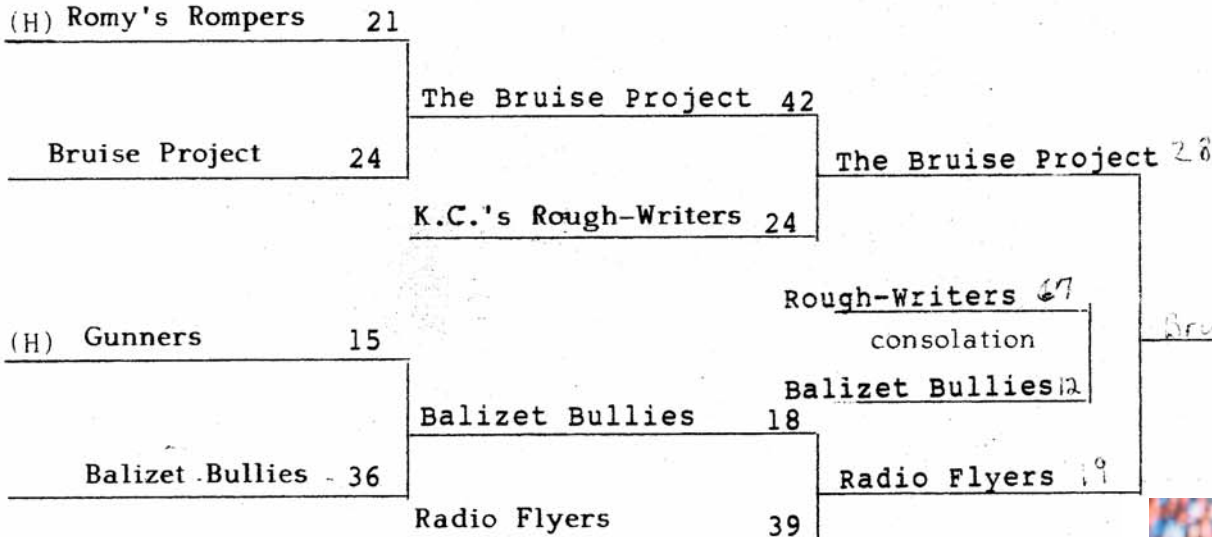

FANTASY FOOTBALL REPORT - NFL WEEK # 15

Next stop - the Fantasy Bowl! And two solid, high-scoring teams will be squaring off for the big payday - \$500 for the winner and \$150 for the runner-up. In this corner, representing the Spades Division, is the mighty **Bruise Project**, who exploded for their highest point total of the season in the Division Championship game. For the second time this season, they blasted the regular season division winners, K.C.'s **Rough-Writers** by 18 points. While winning 42-24, The Project had three TD's waiting in the wings.

If you had to score as many points as possible and could only have one quarterback and one running back, most of us would take Dan Marino and Joe Morris. And those behemoths combined for 33 points to devastate the Rough Writers. This weekend, Morris goes up against Green Bay, while Marino, having picked apart the League's best defense (Rams) for five TDP's, must go against a rugged New England defense. These two players are the keys to the Project's success, along with kicker Gary Anderson, whose Steelers are hosting playoff-hungry Kansas City.

In the Hearts Division, regular season winner **Radio Flyers** earned their way into the big show with a convincing 39-18 triumph over the **Balizet Bullies**. The season's highest scoring team, the Flyers were the only one to average over 30 points per game. Herschel Walker's two touchdowns would have given them 51, but the Flyers chose not to run up the score. The key for the Flyers is balance - at QB, Elway scores through the air as well as on the ground. RB Sammy Winder is one of the NFL's leading scorers at that position, as is Walker, and James Brooks of Cincinnati is a flashy runner that's always a threat. At Receiver, Billy Brooks, Mike Quick and Steve Largent are all the favorites of their respective quarterbacks, and invariably at least one of them has a multi-touchdown game (this time it was Largent with 2 TD's.)

The Fantasy Bowl promises to be a nerve wracker for the participants, since the final NFL weekend starts Friday night and continues throughout the weekend to Monday night. See-saw battles are expected. In the consolation game, the **Bullies** and **Rough Writers** will square-off for the \$75 consolation cash.

FANTASY REPORT - NFL WEEK #10

With the playoffs fast approaching, it appears that only injury can stop the **Gunners**. The 4-4 record is deceiving, primarily due to early season injuries to Ken O'Brien, Jim McMahon, Roy Green, and a spotty running game. After a slump which resulted in a four game losing streak, the team has reeled off three straight victories, averaging an incredible 44.6 points per game. They hit their average last week, thanks to a record-setting performance by Ken O'Brien, who found Wesley Walker once and Al Toon twice, contributing to the **Gunners** 44-11 pasting of the **Raiders**.

Still in first place in the Hearts Division, and playing extremely well, are the **Radio Flyers**, whose coach, Greg Gregoire, sagely benched Herschel Walker in favor of James Brooks (CIN), picking up 12 points on the maneuver in a 36-9 shellacking of the **Red River Wetbacks**. The **Gunners** and **Flyers** are currently the two hottest, and highest scoring teams in the league.

In a bit of an upset, **The Bruise Project** was dropped out of a first-place tie by **Bud's Warriors**, who amassed 34 points on Sunday and sat back to watch Monday Night Football knowing that Dan Marino would have to fire 4 TD passes to beat him. If anybody could, it would be Marino, but the Cleveland defense cut him short. Marino's two TDP's gave the Project 30 points, the second highest losing score of the season.

The squeaker of the week was the **Romy's Rompers** 21-19 victory over **Tucker's Fredricksons**, who needed a Monday night score by James Pruitt of Miami, but couldn't get the points. In a key Spades Division matchup, **K.C.'s Rough-Writers** roughed-up **Bray's Bombers**, whose fuselage was emptied by injuries (Danny White) and defensive games against the NFL's Cowboys and Rams. In a Hearts rivalry, old buddies **Balizet Bullies** and **Hardy's Hardasses** squared off, with the Bullies staying in the playoff picture with a 22-6 victory, possibly snuffing out the Hardasses' playoff hopes.

KEY MATCH-UPS: Match-ups are the name of the game now, with three games until the playoffs and all but a couple of teams in contention. The b-b-b-bad to the b-b-b-b-bone battle between **Bray's Bombers** and **Balizet's Bullies** (the Killer B's?) will pit two teams on the playoff bubble. Another major match-up is the **Bruise Project**, one game off the pace in the Spades, going against hearts pace-setter **Radio Flyers**. A Project loss would tighten the Spades race considerably, and a Flyers loss would make the race for the Hearts title (and the first-round bye) a photo finish. **The Gunners** will tangle with division rival **Bud's Warriors**, who are locked in a tight struggle with the Bullies for a playoff spot. If the Gunners lose (with the Jets playing the Colts?), they could make that Division race a five team affair with only two games left.
