



t took eight seasons, a league record six playoff Lbids and four Final Four appearances, but the founding franchise of the AWFFL, K.C.'s Rough Writers, finally won the league championship. The incredible twist to this improbable scenario is that the Roughies faced elimination since October. One loss in any of their last nine games would have, once again, relegated them to also-ran status. But this time, in true fantasy football tradition, luck joined the team and never left.

The Roughies' 37-3 Fantasy Bowl triumph over the **Cowboys** denied Way's Pokes the historic honor of becoming

the league's first two-time champion. They won it all in 1991, and are now the fourth team to play in more than one Fantasy Bowl, joining the **McRockers** (102), **Death Campers** (102), and **Sandy's Tight Ends** (0-2). Coming off a weekly high 49 points in their semifinal matchup with **Stu Bruisers**, the Cowboys managed only seven points in the Fantasy Bowl, all from their bottom game.
